How it works: Each May, the winning entries from each of 82 contests from Anchorage to Miami gather to compete in the Grand Nationals – approximately 250 entries in each event. After preliminary rounds all day Saturday, the top 48 entries in each speech event advance to Sunday's Octofinals, with cuts to 24 (Quarterfinals), 12 (Semifinals), and 6 (Finals) after that. Danville has won the Louisville area contest each year for the last twenty years – since 1997!
